922 KAR 2:090. Section 6. License Issuance.

- (5) An individual described in subsection (4) of this section shall:
- (a) Submit to background checks described in paragraph (b) of this subsection;
- (b) May be employed or work with a child on a probationary basis for up to ninety (90) calendar days, pending completion of a:
- 1. Child abuse or neglect check using the central registry in accordance with 922 KAR 1:470;
- 2. Criminal records check required by KRS 199.896(19);
- 3. Criminal records check for any previous state of residence if the person resided outside the state of Kentucky in the last five (5) years; and
- 4. An address check of the Sex Offender Registry; and
- (c) Not be left alone in the presence of a child until copies of the background checks in accordance with paragraph (b) of this subsection have been received by the licensee.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the child care director did not present verification that the child abuse/neglect check (CAN) had been submitted/conducted within the required timeframes as required by 922 KRS1:470, for two (2) employees with the hire date of 02/13/2017. The employees were not observed working alone.

315 - Educational Requirements

Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

- (1) Child-care center staff:
 - (a) Hired after January 1, 2009, who have supervisory power over a minor and are not enrolled in secondary education, shall have a:
 - 1. High school diploma:
 - 2. GED or qualifying documentation from a comparable educational entity; or
 - 3. Commonwealth Child Care Credential as described in 922 KAR 2:250;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the child care director did not present verification that the record for an employee with the hire date of 02/13/2017 contained a copy of a high school diploma, a GED or qualifying documentation from a comparable educational entity, or Commonwealth Child Care Credential as described in 922 KAR 2:250.

320 - TB Verification Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

- (1) Child-care center staff:
- (b) Shall provide, prior to employment and every two (2) years thereafter:
- 1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or
- 2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the child care director did not present verification that the record for employees with the hire dates of 02/06/2008, 02/13/2017, 03/22/2017 and 08/10/2017 contained a current copy of a statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or a copy of negative tuberculin results.

340 - Training Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

- (14) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½)

hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training; and

(c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the child care director did not present verification that the records for two (2) employees with the hire date of 02/13/2017 and one employee with a hire date of 08/10/2017 contained verification of the completion of new orientation training within the first ninety (90) days of employment.

Programming Not In Compliance

350 - Program of Activities Followed

922 KAR 2:120. Section 2. Child Care Services.

- (4) The child-care center shall provide a daily planned program:
- (a) Posted in writing in a conspicuous location with each age group and followed;
- (b) Of activities that are individualized and developmentally appropriate for each child served;
- (c) That provides experience to promote the individual child's physical, emotional, social, and intellectual growth and well-being; and
- (d) That offers a variety of creative activities including the following:
- 1. Art:
- 2. Music;
- 3. Dramatic play;
- 4. Stories and books;
- 5. Science;
- 6. Block building;
- 7. Tactile activity;
- 8. Culture:
- 9. Indoor or outdoor play in which a child makes use of both small and large muscles;
- 10. A balance of active and quiet play, including group and individual activity;
- 11. An opportunity for a child to:
- a. Have some free choice of activities;
- b. If desired, play apart from the group at times;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to comply with programming requirements. Upon request, the child care director did not present verification that the daily activity of programming was posted in writing that had been updated to reflect the current week and included the activities that are individualized and developmentally appropriate for each child for the children in classroom twelve (12) and classroom thirteen (13).

420 - Infant Sleep Position Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 6. Sleeping and Napping Requirements.

(1) An infant shall sleep or nap on the infant's back unless the infant's health professional signs a waiver that states the infant requires an alternate sleeping position.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the child care center failed to comply with programming requirements. A ten-month-old infant was observed sleeping in a swing from 10:24 a.m. to 10:38 a.m., in the infant classroom. Per interview with the staff member, there was no signed waiver from a health professional stating that the infant required an alternate sleep position.

Premises Not In Compliance

460 - Inaccessible Items Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 3. General Requirements.

- (7) Except in accordance with subsection (8) of this section, the following shall be inaccessible to a child in care:
- (a) Toxic cleaning supplies, poisons, and insecticides;
- (b) Knives and sharp objects;
- (c) Matches, cigarettes, lighters, and flammable liquids;
- (d) Plastic bags;
- (e) Litter and rubbish;
- (f) Bar soap; and
- (g) Personal belongings and medications of staff.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. The following items were located on the counter, adjacent to the window, and accessible to children in the infant room: knitting needles, glass Pyrex dish, staff purse and keys. Interview with the staff revealed the infant room did have an infant who was mobile and able to pull him/herself up.

480 - Premises Requirements Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

- (1) The premises shall be:
- (a) Suitable for the purpose intended;
- (b) Kept clean and in good repair;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. In classroom twelve (12), the green area rug was frayed around the edges, creating a tripping hazard. Additionally, the beige area rug in classroom nineteen (19) was soiled and stained with black spots.

922 KAR 2:120. Section 8. Kitchen Requirements.

- (4) A cold-storage facility used for storage of perishable food in a nonfrozen state shall:
- (a) Have an indicating thermometer or other appropriate temperature measuring device;
- (b) Be in a safe environment for preservation; and
- (c) Be forty (40) degrees Fahrenheit or below.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain food service in accordance with regulatory requirements. The refrigerator located the infant classroom revealed there was no thermometer present to indicate the temperature of forty (40) degrees Fahrenheit or below.

1060 - Snack Requirements Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 9. Food and Meal Requirements.

- (18) A snack shall include two (2) of the following:
- (a) Milk;
- (b) Protein;
- (c) Bread; or
- (d)1. Fruit;
- 2. Vegetable; or
- 3. 100 percent juice.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain food service in accordance with regulatory requirements. One of the children's snack in classroom thirteen (13) consisted of Cheetos, apple slices and water. No additional components were offered or served to include one of the following: milk, protein, fruit, vegetable, or 100 percent juice.

- (1) A child-care center shall maintain:
- (b) A written record for each child:
 - 1. Completed and signed by the child's parent;
 - 2. Retained on file on the first day the child attends the child-care center; and
 - 3. To contain:
 - a. Identifying information about the child, which includes, at minimum, the child's name, address, and date of birth;
 - b. Contact information to enable a person in charge to contact the child's:
 - (i) Parent at the parent's home or place of employment;
 - (ii) Family physician; and
 - (iii) Preferred hospital;
 - c. The name of each person who is designated in writing to pick-up the child;
 - d. The child's general health status and medical history including, if applicable:
 - (i) Allergies;
 - (ii) Restriction on the child's participation in activities with specific instructions from the child's parent or health professional; and
 - (iii) Permission from the parent for third-party professional services in the child-care center;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain children's records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the child care director did not present verification that the records for three (3) children with the enrollment date of 08/10/2017 contained information listing a name of a preferred hospital.
