- (14) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and onehalf (1  $\frac{1}{2}$ ) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

## Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Review of presented staff files revealed a staff member with the hire date 10/31/00 did not complete Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training. Review of the ECE TRIS report verified the training hours were not completed. Interview with the staff in charge revealed she was unable to locate the documents at the time of the survey.

General: Based on Review of Documentation, and interview, the child care center failed to comply with regulatory programming requirements. Review of documentation revealed the child care center did not present a daily planned program, posted in writing in a conspicuous location. Interview with a staff member revealed she was unable to locate the document at the time of the survey.

General: Based on Observation, the child care center failed to maintain an outdoor play area in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the playground revealed a wooden play apparatus with a broken blue handle protruding in the area where children were playing. Continued observation of the playground revealed metal pegs in the black edging that were raised which created a tripping hazard for children.

#### Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, and interview, the child care center failed to maintain children's records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Review of ten (10) children's files revealed the following: 1. Seven (7) files did not contain authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence, 2. One (1) file did not contain the child's family physician. Interview with the staff in charge revealed she was unable to locate the documentation at the time of the survey.

Review of presented documentation revealed the child care center had an evacuation plan dated October 2015. Interview with the staff in charge revealed she was unable to locate an updated evacuation plan.

Interview with the staff in charge revealed she was unable to locate the document at the time of the survey.

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General: Based on Review of Documentation, and interview, the child care center failed to maintain written documentation in accordance with regulatory requirements. Review of the earthquake drill form revealed the child care center did not present written documentation of the earthquake drill conducted for the second quarter of 2016. Interview with the staff in charge revealed the earthquake drill had been conducted for the second quarter of 2016, but was not documented with the date, time and the names of the children who participated.
