Findings:

General: Upon request, a High School diploma, GED or qualifying documentation from a comparable educational entity, or a Commonwealth Child Care Credential was not presented for review for a staff member with the hire date 10/12/2021.



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405 - TB Verification Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (1) Child-care center staff:
- (b) Shall provide, prior to employment and every two (2) years thereafter:
- 1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or
- 2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

Findings:

General: Upon request, a current written statement from a health care professional stating that the staff member with the hire date 10/05/2015 was free of active tuberculosis or a copy of a tuberculin result was not presented for review on the day of the inspection.

General: Upon request, verification that the staff member with the hire date 10/05/2015 had completed the required first aid and cardiopulmonary resuscitation training was not presented for review on the day of the inspection.

Findings:

General: Upon request, verification that a staff member with the hire date 10/05/2015 had completed one and one half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training once every five (5) years was not presented for review. Review of the Early Care and Education Training Records Information System (ECE-TRIS) report did not verify that the training hours had been completed by the staff member with the hire date 10/05/2022. The document presented for review expired 11/02/2021.

Findings:

General: Observation of a walkway within the cafeteria revealed an industrial size bucket full of water with a cleaning solution and a mop that was accessible to the children.

(20) An outdoor play area shall be:

- (d) Safe from foreseeable hazard;
- (e) Well drained;
- (f) Well maintained;

- (h) Visible to staff at all times.

Findings:

General: Observation of the large outdoor play area revealed there were numerous areas of the play area that contained large amounts of torn, wrinkled, and gathered black landscape material. The landscape material is a foreseeable tripping hazard.



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800 - Protective Surface Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

- (21) A protective surface shall:
- (a) Be provided for outdoor play equipment used to:
- 1. Climb;
- 2. Swing; and
- 3. Slide; and
- (b) Have a fall zone equal to the height of the equipment.

Findings:

General: Observation of the child care center revealed the following:

- 1. There were two (2) slides within the small outdoor play area that did contain sufficient protective surfacing at the foot of each slide. The ground was visible.
- 2. There were four (4) swings within the large outdoor play area that did not contain sufficient protective surfacing under each of the swings. The ground was visible.

1095 - Milk Requirements

General: Observation of the small and large outdoor play area revealed there were black plastic borders around the perimeter of each play area. On both of the play areas the borders were cut in sections and a portion of the border was removed to craft a walkway, leaving the ends of the cut borders with sharp edges that were accessible to the children.

General: Observation of snack being served to the children revealed the children were given a choice of fat free milk, strawberry milk, and chocolate milk. Children were observed choosing and consuming strawberry milk and chocolate milk. Therefore, flavored milk was served to the children.

General: Upon request, a current immunization certificate was not presented for review for a child with the enrollment date 08/12/2021. The document presented expired 04/06/2022.

General: Review of children's files revealed the following:

- 1. There was a child with the enrollment date 08/12/2021 whose file listed a non-existent hospital as a preferred hospital. Therefore, a preferred hospital was not listed.
- 2. The files for two (2) children with the enrollment date 08/12/2021 that did not list a family physician.
