- (7) The following shall be inaccessible to a child in care:
- (a) Toxic cleaning supplies, poisons, and insecticides;
- (b) Matches, cigarettes, lighters, and flammable liquids; and
- (c) Personal belongings and medications of staff.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a white plastic bag full of loose plastic bags hung on a purple milk crate in the three-year-olds' restroom. A white plastic bag full of loose bags were stored in the unlocked red cabinet in the four-year-olds' classroom. Five (5) rolls of plastic black garbage bag and a roll of plastic green garbage bags were stored in the bottom two (2) drawers of the cabinet in the school-age 1 classroom. All of these items were accessible to children and were not part of the planned program of instruction.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, an accumulation of dust and dead bugs were in the light fixture in the pre-K boys' restroom. In addition, a thick accumulation of dust was in the light fixture in the preschool 2 girls' restroom.

645 - Sink Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (3) A sink shall be:
- (a) Located in or immediately adjacent to toilet rooms;
- (b) Equipped with hot and cold running water that allows for hand washing;
- (c) Equipped with hot water at a minimum temperature of ninety (90) degrees Fahrenheit and a maximum of 120 degrees Fahrenheit;
- (d) Equipped with liquid soap;
- (e) Equipped with hand-drying blower or single use disposable hand drying material;
- (f) Equipped with an easily cleanable waste receptacle; and
- (g) Immediately adjacent to a changing area used for infants and toddlers.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the hot water temperature registered eighty (80) degrees Fahrenheit at the sink in the Toddler 1 classroom. In addition, the hot water temperature registered eighty (80) degrees Fahrenheit at the sink in the Toddler 1 restroom.

650 - Toilet Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (4) Each toilet shall:
- (a) Be kept in clean condition;
- (b) Be kept in good repair;
- (c) Be in a lighted room; and
- (d) Have ventilation to outside air.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the exhaust vent was not in working condition in the Toddler 2 restroom.

- 1. Upon arrival at the center;
- 2. After toileting or assisting a child in toileting;
- 3. Before and after diapering each child;
- 4. After wiping or blowing a child's or own nose;
- 5. After handling animals;
- 6. After caring for a sick child;
- 7. Before and after feeding a child or eating;
- 8. Before dispensing medication;
- 9. After smoking or vaping; and
- 10. If possible, before administering first aid; and
- (d) Use hand sanitizer or hand-sanitizing wipes if liquid soap and warm running water are not available in accordance with paragraph (c) of this subsection. The staff shall wash the staff's hands as soon as practicable once liquid soap and warm running water are available.

General: Based on observation, a caregiver did not wash her hands before and after diapering a child in the in the Two II classroom.

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the medication log did not have the name of the person who administered Bramphen on 10/28/20 and the person who administered Zarbees Cough and Mucus Syrup on 3/15/21.
