(20) An outdoor play area shall be:

(d) Safe from foreseeable hazard;

(e) Well drained;

(f) Well maintained;

(g) In good repair; and

(h) Visible to staff at all times.

Findings:

General: Based on observation during a tour of the infant/toddler playground, the surveyor found:

1. That grass was growing through the mulch under the swings, by the play boat, and by the frog climbing structure; therefore, the playground is not well maintained.

2. The picnic table has a broken yellow bench that is hanging down to the ground on one side of the bench; therefore, the playground is not well maintained.

During interview, staff stated they have not used the playground recently.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the temperature of the surveyor was not taken before the surveyor was permitted entry into the childcare center. During interview, staff stated that they were aware that they needed to take the surveyor's temperature upon entrance to the center.

This deficiency was cited due to the following E-Reg: 922 KAR 2:415E

Section 7. Screening and Illness Requirements. (1) Children and adults shall be screened for fever and contagious symptoms upon entry into the child care center or family child care home each day and shall not be allowed to enter if displaying a contagious fever or symptom of COVID-19.
