General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The following was found:

1. During a tour of one of the preschool rooms (three - four year olds), the surveyor observed multiple electrical cords hanging loose throughout the classroom from floor lamps, hanging lights and a video camera. These cords were accessible to the children.

2. The surveyor observed the roll of paper towels that the four - five year old children use is stored in an unsanitary manner, positioned on a metal bar above the toilet. This method of storage promotes germs due to each child handling the roll to obtain a paper towel.

Later in the day, the director sent an email stating that all of the staff and children had walked to a local park behind the facility at the time of the visit and indicated that they do this almost daily. The emergency regulations state that field trips are not permitted at this time.
