General: Based on review of documentation, a staff person who is a substitute did not have a documented date of hire.

# 922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (1) Child-care center staff:
- (b) Shall provide, prior to employment and every two (2) years thereafter:
- 1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or
- 2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

#### Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the following was found:

- 1) A staff person hired 10/3/1983 had the results of a T.B. risk assessment dated 8/10/2018.
- 2) A staff person hired 3/19/2021 had the results of a T.B. risk assessment dated 7/30/2019.

These dates exceed the two-year timeframe for a negative T.B. test or documentation from a health professional verifying the individual is free from the symptoms of T.B.

On 9/13/2021 the facility submitted an e-mail containing updated T.B. risk assessments for these individuals. However, at the time of the survey on 9/13/2021, these documents were not available for review.

- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation completed within the first three (3) months of employment in a child-care program;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1  $^{1\!2}$ ) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training completed between July 1 and the following June 30 of each subsequent year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

#### Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the following was found:

- 1) A staff member hired on 2/11/2016, completed PAHT training on 4/6/2016; however, did not renew the training due 4/6/2021. The ECE-TRIS system was reviewed.
- 2) A staff member hired on 3/19/2012 completed PAHT training on 7/28/2016; however, did not renew the training due 7/28/2021. The ECE-TRIS system was reviewed.

# 730 - Diaper Changing Area/Surface 922 KAR 2:120. Section 12. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

(10) When a child is diapered, the child shall:

- (b) Be placed on a surface that is:
- 1. Clean;
- 2. Padded;
- 3. Free of holes, rips, tears, or other damage;
- 4. Nonabsorbent:
- 5. Easily cleaned; and
- 6. Free of any items not used for diaper changing.

### Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, at the time of the survey, soiled diapers were observed in the trashcan located in the bathroom. An interview with the staff person in charge found that when changing a child's diaper, the child is placed on a blanket on the floor in the bathroom. The same blanket is used for all children. When diapering a child they should be placed on a padded, non-absorbent easily cleaned surface. The blanket cannot be sanitized after each use.

- 2. Maintained in a sanitary manner; and

General: Based on observation, an inspection of the first aid supplies found there was not a CPR mouthpiece or a working flashlight available for use if needed.
