Findings:

General: Based on observation in Classroom #5, the surveyor found the electric cord of a wax warmer hanging down the side of a shelving unit. The cord was accessible to the children in care.

In addition, the surveyor observed 11 bins of toys stacked in disarray on top of a three-tiered shelving unit, which created a risk of falling onto the children in care.

General: Based on review of documentation and ECE-TRIS, one staff person hired on 10/14/2009, only completed 14 hours of early care and education training from 07/01/20 to 06/30/2021.

Findings:

General: Based on observation in Classroom #5, the surveyor found empty shelves and few toys available to the four toddlers present in the classroom. For instance, the surveyor observed one pull toy, two cars, two puzzles without puzzle pieces, one stacking toy, and a few large Legos scattered around the floor. The surveyor observed a pretend couch turned sideways and against the wall, and 11 bins of toys stacked on top of a three-tiered shelving unit. The staff person indicated that she had placed the bins on the shelving unit the day before because she needed to wash the toys.
