General: Based on observation and interview, the family child care provider failed to assure compliance with regulatory requirements. Upon entry into the home, eight (8) children were in care with the sole provider until 9:40 A.M when an assistant arrived. Interview revealed the youngest child was 5 months of age and the oldest child was 3 years of age. An additional infant entered into the program at approximately 9:50 A.M.

Two of the children were observed sleeping with loose blankets, and a third child was observed sleeping wrapped in a blanket, in a bouncy seat.

Observation revealed two (2) infants sleeping in cribs with loose blankets. An infant was also observed sleeping wrapped in a blanket, in a bouncy seat. Additionally, there were only two (2) cribs available, however, there were five (5) infants in attendance.

Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), certified family child care homes must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:405E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the family child care home provider failed to assure compliance with emergency regulatory requirements. Upon arrival, the surveyor's temperature failed to be taken. Additionally, the assistant's temperature also was not taken upon her arrival and entry into the programming area. The provider was observed without a facial covering when she allowed the surveyor's entry into the home.
