General: Based on observation, a bottle of Crest Pro Health Advantage with the warning: Keep Out of the Reach of children under the age of 6 years, was observed sitting on the bathroom sink and accessible to the children in care.

#### Findings

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the family child care provider failed to have a completed KARES report contained in the file for an adult who periodically lives in the home. A review of a KARES report failed to verify eligibility through the NBCP. Interview with the provider revealed the documentation was not available at the time of the inspection.

- (b) Submit a copy of negative tuberculin results or a health professional's statement documenting that the adult is free of active tuberculosis.

#### Findings

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care provider failed to reveal negative results from a tuberculosis test, or a written statement from a health care provider stating the individual is free of tuberculosis. Interview with the provider revealed the father of her children lives sporadically in the home, and the document was not available at the time of the inspection.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation of the kitchen it was revealed knives were stored in a low kitchen drawer which was accessible to the children, and failed to contain a lock or device to prevent accessibility.

- (d) Be inaccessible to a child when not in use.
- (18) An above-ground pool shall have:
- (a) A stationary wall no less than four (4) feet tall; and
- (b) Hand holds or foot holds that are inaccessible when the pool is not in use.

General: Based on observation, a large covered swimming pool located in the backyard failed to provide a gate or obstruction to prevent accessibility to it by the children.

The certified family child-care home provider shall: (7) Make available to a parent upon request:

- (a) The staff to child ratios described in Section 10 of this administrative regulation;
- (b) The planned program of activities;
- (c) Each statement of deficiency issued by the cabinet during the current certification period;
- (d) Each plan of correction submitted by the certified family child-care home to the cabinet during the current certification period; and
- (e) Daily schedule including any trips outside the family child-care home;

#### Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the family child care provider failed to have posted the current statement of deficiency (SOD) from the cabinet and the current plan of corrections submitted to the cabinet by the provider. The SOD posted was dated 2018. Interview with the provider revealed the documents were not available at the time of the inspection.
