General: Based on observation, the surveyor found a bottle of hand sanitizer placed on a white shelf in the kitchen area located under a wall mounted television that stated "Keep Out of the Reach of Children" on the back label. The bottle of hand sanitizer was observed to be within reach of the children.

Findings

General: Based on review of documentation, the surveyor found that an adult's (Start Date: 01/05/18) file did not contain documentation of background checks submitted through the Kentucky National Background Check Service. Based on review of the Kentucky National Background Check Service, the adult did not have a completed background check. The surveyor did not observe the adult to be present at the providers home on 03/28/22. During interview, the provider stated that the adult lives in the home and has not worked alone with the children. The provider stated that the adult turned eighteen (18) years of age recently and did not have a completed background check through the Kentucky National Background Check Service. The adult's file did not contain a completed Child Abuse/Neglect Background Check or Criminal Records Background Check.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the surveyor found that an adult's (Start Date: 01/05/18) file did not contain documentation of a current TB skin test or a statement from a health professional stating that the adult was free from active tuberculosis. During interview, the provider stated that the adult lives in the home and has not had an up-to-date TB skin test.

General: Based on review of documentation and ECE-TRIS, the surveyor found that a provider (DOH: 01/05/18) obtained zero (0) hours of the required fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training for the review period 07/01/20 – 06/30/21. During interview, the provider stated that she completed fifteen (15) hours of training; however, the provider stated that she started completing the trainings in September 2021.

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found an unlocked cabinet drawer located near the entrance into the dining/kitchen area of the providers home that contained what appeared to be pliers, two (2) small containers of nails and other items. The provider stated that she would move the items to make them inaccessible to the children.

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. Two (2) metal poles and one (1) long piece of wood with splintered edges placed underneath a wooden play structure on the playground.
- 2. A piece of wood that was no longer attached and exposing a nail located at the end of a ramp on a wooden play structure located on the playground.
- 3. A wheel barrow located on the playground that contained a piece of wood that had two (2) exposed nails and one (1) shovel.
- 4. A cement block located on the playground near a porch. The cement block created a tripping hazard for the children.
- 5. A large piece of plywood placed on the ground near a cement block on the playground.
- 6. Loose garden hoses located on the playground. During interview, the provider stated that the garden hoses are used for her dogs; however, she would relocate the garden hoses.

- 1. A child's (DOE: 07/12/21) file did not contain the name of the child's preferred family physician or contact telephone number or the contact telephone number for the child's preferred hospital.
- 2. A child's (DOE: 11/18/16) file did not contain information about the child's medical history regarding any allergies the child may have.
