### Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, this regulatory requirement was not met. An adult living in the certified provider's home did not have a current TB skin test on file. The TB skin test on file was dated 11/24/2018. TB skin tests are valid for two years.

(1)(a) Between July 1 and June 30 of the following calendar year, a provider shall complete at least nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training beginning with the second year of operation, including one and one-half (1½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training in accordance with KRS 199.8982(2) to be completed:

- 1. Within the second year of employment or operation in child care; and
- 2. Every subsequent five (5) years of employment or operation in child care.
- (b) A provider or assistant's compliance with the training in accordance with paragraph (a) of this subsection or subsection (8) of this section shall be verified through the cabinet-designed database maintained pursuant to 922 KAR 2:240.

### Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The certified provider did not complete the nine hours of cabinet-approved training in early care and education between 7/01/2020 and 6/30/2021. The provider completed 5.75 training hours. The ECE-TRIS system was reviewed.

- e. The name and phone number of each person to be contacted in an emergency situation involving or impacting the child;
- f. Authorization by the parent for the provider to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence;

### Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, this regulatory requirement was not met. One child's enrollment paperwork was missing the physician's phone number. This area was left blank.
