Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. In the Three Year Old Classroom, the posted program of activities was dated 11/9/2020-11/13/2020; therefore, the lesson plans were not updated as required.
- 2. In the Four Year Old Classroom, the posted program of activities was dated 11/9/2020-11/13/2020; therefore, the lesson plans were not updated as required.

During interview, the director stated that she would update the lesson plans weekly.

1250 - Emergency Regulation Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:400E. Emergency Regulation.

Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), licensed child care centers must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:400E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor observed a staff person in the One and Two Year Old Classroom wearing her mask only over the mouth. Therefore, the proper Personal Protective Equipment was not being utilized correctly. The staff person was within six (6) feet of another staff person and children.

This deficiency was cited due to the following E-Reg: 922 KAR 2:400E

Section 7. Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) Requirements. (1) Each adult, including parents and guardians at drop-off and pick-up, shall wear a facemask while inside a child care center: (a) Unless doing so would represent a serious risk to their health or safety and they are able to present a medical statement stating this; (b) Except during planned staff breaks and lunch away from children in care and other staff.
