- (3) A sink shall be:
- (a) Located in or immediately adjacent to toilet rooms;
- (b) Equipped with hot and cold running water that allows for hand washing;
- (c) Equipped with hot water at a minimum temperature of ninety (90) degrees Fahrenheit and a maximum of 120 degrees Fahrenheit;
- (d) Equipped with liquid soap;
- (e) Equipped with hand-drying blower or single use disposable hand drying material;
- (f) Equipped with an easily cleanable waste receptacle; and
- (g) Immediately adjacent to a changing area used for infants and toddlers.

### Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the water temperature was measured at the sinks used for handwashing with a calibrated thermometer. It was found that the water temperature measured approximately 140 degrees Fahrenheit at each sink. It was also observed that a sink located in the EH 1 & 2 Room did not have hot running water. An interview with one of the staff in the room found that sometimes the water does get hot but not always. An interview with the staff person in charge found that the sink is not used for handwashing and that staff and children wash their hands at the sink in the bathroom.

- (2) Indoor and outdoor equipment shall:
- (a) Be clean, safe, and in good repair;
- (b) Meet the physical, developmental needs, and interests of children of different age groups;
- (c) Be free from sharp points or corners, splinters, protruding nails or bolts, loose or rusty parts, hazardous small parts, lead-based paint, poisonous material, and flaking or chalking paint; and
- (d) Be designed to guard against entrapment or situations that may cause strangulation.

# Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation at the time of the survey, a Super Safe Froggy Jumper mini trampoline with a hand rail was observed in both classrooms. A review of information on the product's website found the equipment is for use with children ages three- to six-years-old. The children who were present at the time of the survey were ages one- to two-years-old. A review of the American Academy of Pediatrics website recommends that children under six should never use this type of trampoline because of the high risk of injury resulting in sprains and fractures in the arms or legs as well as head and neck injuries. Therefore, the equipment is not safe for the age of the children served and it does not meet the developmental needs of the children in care.
