General: Based on Observation, thirty-five (35) preschool and school age children were moved from licensed space in the youth gym to a non-licensed space in the adult gym. Interview determined the center had a broken heat exchanger which allowed no heat in the licensed space. Therefore, the center failed to notify the cabinet prior to moving the children to a non-licensed space.

- 2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, a director hired on 7/31/06, had a TB test administered, but did not have documentation of a read TB skin test. A caregiver hired on 11/7/16, had no TB documentation on file.

340 - Training Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

- (14) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 $\frac{1}{2}$) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, a director hired on 7/31/06, lacked eight (8) hours of training. A caregiver hired on 1/24/14, lacked fifteen (15) hours of training. Also, a caregiver hired on 5/13/16, had not completed orientation training.

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, there were three (3) ceiling tiles which had brown circles and one of these ceiling tiles sagged. These were located in the boys' locker room near the door which led into the boys' restroom. Also, a two (2) foot long and nine (9) inch wide hole was in the wall below a wooden bench in the boys' locker room near the door to the boys' restroom. In addition, white streaks and chipped blue paint were on the wall of the youth gym next to the exit doors. Interview determined there was a roof leak which caused the streaks and chipped paint.

General: Based on Observation, a twelve (12) inch long and four (4) inch wide hole was in a wooden storage unit which held toys in the youth gym.

Interview determined that prior to summer camp, the center received an agreement from the third party for transportation but it was not available for review during the inspection.

General: Based on Observation, the center had available 2% reduced fat milk for the preschool and/or school age children during lunch. Interview determined if a child did not bring milk from home the center served the two (2) percent reduced fat milk.
