General: Based on review of documentation, a staff member hired on 7/22/19, had no documentation of education on file.

- (b) Shall provide, prior to employment and every two (2) years thereafter:
- 1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or
- 2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, a staff member hired on 7/22/19, had no TB documentation on file. A caregiver hired on 8/28/17, had TB documentation on file dated 8/28/17.

410 - Training Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 $\frac{1}{2}$) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

General: Based on review of documentation, two (2) caregivers hired on 6/10/19 and 6/3/19, each had not completed the six (6) hours orientation training.

- (c) Be periodically inventoried to ensure the supplies have not expired;
- (d) If reusable, be:
- 1. Sanitized; and
- 2. Maintained in a sanitary manner; and
- (e) Include:
- 1. Liquid soap;
- 2. Adhesive bandages;
- 3. Sterile gauze;
- 4. Medical tape;
- 5. Scissors;
- 6. A thermometer;
- 7. Flashlight;
- 8. Cold pack;
- 9. First aid book;
- 10. Disposable gloves; and
- 11. A cardiopulmonary resuscitation mouthpiece protector.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the first aid supplies had no flashlight and first aid book.



730 - Medication Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 7. First Aid and Medicine.

- (6) Medication, including refrigerated medication, shall be:
- (a) Stored in a separate and locked place, out of the reach of a child unless the medication is:
- 1. A first aid supply and is maintained in accordance with subsection (1) of this section;
- 2. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste shall be inaccessible to a child;
- 3. An epinephrine auto-injector. A licensed child-care center shall comply with KRS 199.8951 and 311.646, including:
- a. An epinephrine auto-injector shall be inaccessible to a child;
- b. A child-care center shall have at least one (1) person onsite who has received training on the administration of an epinephrine auto-injector if the child-care center maintains an epinephrine auto-injector;
 - c. A child-care center shall seek emergency medical care for a child if an auto-injector is administered to the child; and
- d. A child-care center shall report to the child's parent and the cabinet in accordance with 922 KAR 2:090, Section 12(1)(b) if an epinephrine auto-injector is administered to a child; or
- 4. An emergency or rescue medication for a child in care, such as medication to respond to diabetic or asthmatic condition, as prescribed by the child's physician. Emergency or rescue medication shall be inaccessible to a child in care;
- (b) Kept in the original bottle; and
- (c) Properly labeled.
- (7) Medication shall not be given to a child if the medication's expiration date has passed.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a tube of Orajel and a bottle of Banana Boat Baby Sunscreen were not labeled to indicate for whom each belonged in a black box.

- (c) Be free from sharp points or corners, splinters, protruding nails or bolts, loose or rusty parts, hazardous small parts, lead-based paint, poisonous material, and flaking or chalking paint; and
- (d) Be designed to guard against entrapment or situations that may cause strangulation.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a top rail of a large playground apparatus had a broken piece which exposed a rusty metal bar in the outdoor play area. The top rail was located near the triangle monkey bars and faced the center. Also, a wooden top rail of a large outdoor playground apparatus was splintery. The wooden top rail was near the blue slide and faced away from the center.

General: Based on interview, the center had taken two (2) field trips during the summer of 2019 but the center had no documentation available for review of the routes taken to and from both field trips.

- (3) Prior to transporting a child, a center providing transportation services of a child shall notify the cabinet or its designee in writing of the:

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, there was no current third party transportation agreement. The last agreement was dated 6/1/17 - 8/6/18.

General: Based on interview, the center had taken two (2) field trips during the summer of 2019, but the center had no documentation of the children's transportation records for both field trips.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the posted menu indicated lunch was served from 11:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. and snack at 3:00 p.m. Therefore, the meals were not served every two (2) to three (3) hours.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, a child enrolled on 3/16/2020, had no physician's phone number and preferred hospital listed in their enrollment information. Two (2) children, enrolled on 3/13/2020 and 3/16/2020, had no physician's phone number listed in their enrollment information. A child enrolled on 3/16/2020, had no preferred hospital in their enrollment information. A child enrolled on 3/16/2020, had no physician's phone number, no parent's signature, and no permission from the parent for the center to seek medical care in their enrollment information, and the child's two (2) emergency contacts listed did not have phone numbers.

General: Based on review of documentation, a staff member hired on 7/22/19, and three (3) caregivers hired on 12/5/14, 6/10/19, and 6/3/19, each had no professional development plan on file.

Findings:

General: Based on interview, the center's fire, earthquake, and tornado drills were not available for review. Interview determined the documentation was located at another site.
