General: Based on Interview, a caregiver hired on 8/20/18, painted the toddlers' buttocks orange to make an imprint of their buttocks for an art project labeled "bumpkin". The Crayola Washable Kids' Paint had a label which indicated, "Not for use as body/face paint.

General: Based on Review of Documentation, a caregiver hired on 08/20/18 had TB documentation dated 10/12/16.

545 - Phone Requirement Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

- (1) The premises shall be:
- (c) Equipped with:
- 1. A working telephone accessible to a room used by a child; and
- 2. A list of emergency numbers posted by the telephone or maintained in the telephone's contact, including numbers for the:
- a. Police;
- b. Fire station;
- c. Emergency medical care and rescue squad; and
- d. Poison control center.

Findings:

General: Based on interview with the director, the center's primary business number was the director's cell number. The cell number was used by parents and the public as the childcare center's business phone. When the director was away from the center, the cell phone was not accessible to a room used by a child. Interview determined the there was a landline phone available but it was only for outgoing calls and did not belong to the child-care center. Further interview determined there was a secondary number available for childcare parents but when the secondary number was called, the surveyor was unable to reach the center. Therefore, the center did not have a usable working telephone accessible to a room used by a child.

- (3) Rest time shall include adequate space specified by the child's age as follows:
- (b) For a toddler or preschool-age child:
- 1. An individual bed, a two (2) inch thick waterproof mat, or cot in good repair; and
- 2. Bedding that is in good repair and is changed:
- a. Weekly; or
- b. Immediately if it is soiled or wet.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, four (4) toddlers had no sheets on their cots during naptime in the one-year olds' room.

820 - Indoor/Outdoor Equipment

Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 11. Toys and Furnishings.

- (2) Indoor and outdoor equipment shall:
- (a) Be clean, safe, and in good repair;
- (b) Meet the physical, developmental needs, and interests of children of different age groups;
- (c) Be free from sharp points or corners, splinters, protruding nails or bolts, loose or rusty parts, hazardous small parts, lead-based paint, poisonous material, and flaking or chalking paint; and
- (d) Be designed to guard against entrapment or situations that may cause strangulation.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, a pink Bumbo seat and a blue Bumbo seat were in the infants' room. The Bumbo seats were not equipped with restraint belts. A review of the Consumer Product Safety Commission recall information determined the Bumbo seat was recalled in 2007 and instructed consumers to order a free repair kit which included a restraint belt and a warning label. Therefore, the Bumbo seats were not safe to use.

- (a) A current immunization certificate for each child in care within thirty (30) days of the child's enrollment, unless an attending physician or the child's parent objects to the immunization of the child pursuant to KRS 214.036;

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, a child enrolled on 5/19/18, did not have an immunization cetificate on file for review.
