General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver hired on 1/10/19, had an annual written performance evaluation on file that was dated 6/10/19. Also, three (3) caregivers hired on 10/7/19, 4/3/19, and 9/17/18, did not have an annual written performance evaluation on file.

General: Based on observation, the hot water temperature registered one hundred thirty (130) degrees Fahrenheit at a sink in preschool B restroom. The hot water temperature registered one hundred twenty-eight (128) degrees Fahrenheit at a sink in the two-year-olds' restroom.

- 4. An emergency or rescue medication for a child in care, such as medication to respond to diabetic or asthmatic condition, as prescribed by the child's physician. Emergency or rescue medication shall be inaccessible to a child in care;
- (b) Kept in the original bottle; and
- (c) Properly labeled.
- (7) Medication shall not be given to a child if the medication's expiration date has passed.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, two (2) tubes of Desitin Rapid Relief Diaper Cream Ointment, a tube of Desitin Maximum Strength Diaper Cream Ointment, a tube of Aquaphor Healing Ointment, and two (2) cans of Sport Sunscreen were not labeled to indicate to whom they belonged to in the two-year-olds' room.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, interview and review of documentation, the center failed to assure new staff shall undergo name-based backgrounds in accordance with 922 KAR 2:280 and shall not be left alone with children until name-based background checks have been approved and returned, in accordance with 922 KAR 2:405E Section 11(5). A caregiver hired on 7/28/2020, did not have a processed child abuse/neglect check from Indiana, which was a previous state of residence.



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
