General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the surveyor found that proof of insurance submitted for review was for a policy that expired as of 4/26/19. Staff stated that the policy is current but did not provide updated proof of insurance at the time of inspection.

(16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:

(a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;

(b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 1/2) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and

(c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and onehalf (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, review of ECE-TRIS, and inerview the surveyor found that a staff file (DOH: 9/4/18) presented for review only contained documentation of having completed twelve and a half (12.5) hours of annual training for 9/4/18 - 9/3/19. Staff-in-Charge reported that the staff member took college classes that could be applied toward their annual training; however, she did not have documentation of the college courses completed.

- (7) The following shall be inaccessible to a child in care:
- (a) Toxic cleaning supplies, poisons, and insecticides;
- (b) Matches, cigarettes, lighters, and flammable liquids; and
- (c) Personal belongings and medications of staff.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the surveyor found that an unlocked cabinet located in the preschool classroom contained a bottle of windex and a bottle of bleach solution which were accessible to the children. Staff stated that the cabinet is supposed to remain locked at all times.

525 - Items Accessible Only During Activity

- (8) The following shall be inaccessible to a child in care unless under direct supervision and part of planned program of instruction:
- (a) Knives and sharp objects;
- (b) Litter and rubbish:

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the surveyor found that a loose plastic bag was lying on top of the changing table located in the hallway where it was accessible to children. Staff-in-charge was not aware that the plastic bag was on the changing table.

540 - Premises Requirements

- (a) Suitable for the purpose intended;
- (b) Kept clean and in good repair;

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the surveyor found that the walls in the nursery classroom had a substance splattered on them in various places which had dried and not been wipe off. Staff-in-charge was not aware of what the substance was.

580 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the surveyor found that there was a small hole in the drywall within reach of the children in the nursery classroom; therefore, the drywall dust was exposed and accessible to the children. Staff-in-Charge was not aware of the hole in the wall.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the surveyor found that the changing mat located in the nursery classroom had one (1) hole in the vinyl covering, thus exposing the soft filling and preventing it from being properly sanitized. Staff-in-Charge was unaware of the hole in the changing mat.
