- (b) Request that the prospective child care staff member complete and sign the:
- 1. DCC-500, Applicant Child Care Staff Member Waiver Agreement and Statement; and
- 2. DCC-501, Disclosures to Be Provided to and Signed by the Applicant Child Care Staff Member; and
- (c) Log on to the NBCP portal and enter the prospective child care staff member's demographic information for a check of the:
- 1. Child abuse and neglect central registry pursuant to 922 KAR 1:470;
- 2. National Crime Information Center's National Sex Offender Registry in accordance with 34 U.S.C. 20921; and
- 3. Sex Offender Registry established in accordance with KRS 17.500 through 17.580.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, a caregiver, hire date 09/21/20, did not resubmit a background check upon re-employment. The national background system indicated this staff member was eligible for employment but was separated. Interview determined the staff was separated due to COVID 2020 closure but rehired when the

- (3) For a child-care center licensed for infant, toddler, or preschool-age children, at least one (1) person on duty and present with the children shall be currently certified by a cabinet-approved training agency in the following skills:
- (a) Infant and child cardiopulmonary resuscitation; and
- (b) Infant and child first aid.
- (4) For a child-care center licensed for school-age children, at least one (1) person on duty and present with the children shall be currently certified by a cabinet-approved training agency in the following skills:
- (a) Adult cardiopulmonary resuscitation; and
- (b) First aid.
- (5) Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and first aid training shall be in addition to the fifteen (15) clock hours requirement in subsection (16) of this section.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, two (2) staffs were present when the surveyor arrived to the center at approximately 10:40am on 12/21/21. Review of documentation determined these two (2) staff members did not have proof they were currently certified in first aid and CPR. The director, who had current certification, arrived approximately fifteen (15) minutes later.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation completed within the first three (3) months of employment in a child-care program;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training completed between July 1 and the following June 30 of each subsequent year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

General: Based on record review, a staff hired 06/1/18, completed one (1) hour of annual training from 07/2020 to 06/2021, and a staff hired 3/14/19, completed no training from 07/2020 to 06/2021.

General: Based on observation, the wooden fence was not in good repair as evidenced by the following:

- 1. Two (2) wooden planks were loose and one (1) wooden plank was missing along the right side of the outdoor playground.
- 2. Several wooden planks were detached at the top in the right corner of the wooden fence.
- 3. Screws were exposed where planks detached on back wall of the wooden fence.
- 4. The top half of three (3) planks was missing and one (1) whole wooden plank was missing. Also, a rusty screw was exposed. This was observed on the left side of the wooden fence.
