(3)(a) Each center shall maintain a child-care program that assures each child will be:

- 1. Provided with adequate supervision at all times by a qualified staff person who ensures the child is:
- a. Within scope of vision and range of voice; or
- b. For a school-age child, within scope of vision or range of voice;

Findings:

General: Based on observation upon entry to the childcare center on 11/13/18 at 2:00 p.m., the surveyor observed that one (1) staff person was caring for six (6) children in the Preschool Room and an additional four (4) preschool-age children that were napping in an adjacent room. The surveyor observed that the staff person periodically checked on the four (4) sleeping children by looking around the corner into the adjacent room. The four (4) preschool-age children were not consistently within the staff's scope of vision.

Findings:

General: Based on observation upon entry to the childcare center on 11/13/18 at 2:00 p.m., the surveyor observed that a staff person picked up a child and removed the child from the Preschool Room. Based on interview with staff, the child was one (1) year old. The staff person took the child to the classroom for the one-year-old children. The surveyor found that one (1) staff person in the Preschool Room was providing care for ten (10) children. Based on interview with staff, these children two to three-year-old children. Through staff interview, the surveyor learned that one (1) staff person provided care for the one-year-old child along with ten (10) children over age one (1) for five to ten (5-10) minutes. Therefore, five (5) children exceeded the staff-to-child ratio for five to ten (5-10) minutes.

Findings:

General: Based on observation during a tour of the childcare center on 11/13/18 at 2:00 p.m., the surveyor found that a large stepladder was horizontally propped against a half wall near four (4) preschool-age children that were napping, The ladder was accessible and presented a safety risk to the children.

General: Based on interview with multiple individuals, the surveyor found that on 11/1/18, a staff person used an inappropriately loud tone, described as yelling, when redirecting the preschool-age children.

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
