A caregiver hired 08/11/2020, did not have documentation of completing the mandatory training within ninety (90) days of hire.

New staff shall undergo name-based background in accordance with 922 KAR 2:280 and shall not be left alone with children until name-based background checks have been approved and returned, in accordance with 922 KAR 2:405E Section 11(5). A caregiver hired 09/04/2020, did not have a name-based criminal records check on file from Indiana, which was a previous state of residence, and was left alone and supervised nine (9) children for ten (10) minutes in the preschool area of room #1. Interviews revealed the same caregiver was left alone and supervised children at least three (3) days a week for approximately seven (7) hours a day.
