Findings: General: Based on observation, the surveyor found the following: 1. A small battery box placed on the diaper changing pad table beside the diaper changing pad in the Infant Classroom. The battery box was connected to a set of Christmas lights that were placed on the wall beside the diaper changing table. 2. A black and white cord dangling from a filing cabinet in the Infant Classroom that was observed to be accessible to the children. 3. A plunger placed inside a large sink in the boys' restroom. 4. A toilet brush placed on top of a brown table/shelf by the diaper changing pad. 5. One (1) electrical outlet located beside a brown cabinet in the Two Year Old Classroom that was missing two (2) outlet covers. During interview. staff-in-charge stated that the Two Year Old Classroom was not currently being used by children. 6. One (1) electrical outlet located beside a blue shelf in the Two Year Old Classroom that was missing one (1) outlet cover. 7. A loose cord dangling down a blue shelf from a cd player in the Two Year Old Classroom. 8. Seven (7) blue mats placed on top of a wall shelf above a crib in the Toddler Classroom. 9. A loose cord dangling down beside a crib from a wall mounted tv stand in the Toddler Classroom. 10. What appeared to be parts of a brown crib leaned against the wall underneath a white wall cabinet in the Toddler Classroom.

General: Based on review of documentation, the surveyor found a fire marshal report dated for 04/09/19. During interview, staff-in-charge confirmed that the fire marshal has not been to the child-care center in the last two (2) years. Staff-in-charge stated that she would schedule a visit as soon as possible.

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found the following:

1. A bottle of Soft Soap placed on the sink in the boys and girls' restrooms that stated "Keep Out of the Reach of Children" on the label on the back of the bottle.

2. A spray bottle that had "bleach" written on the front of the bottle placed on the bottom of a green shelf in the girls' restroom.

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found the following:

1. The floor in front of an exit door located in the Two Year Old Classroom contained debris; therefore, the floor was not kept clean.

2. A red chair that contained black stains in the Two Year Old Classroom; therefore, the chair was not kept clean.

3. A square rug that contained stains in the Toddler Classroom; therefore, the rug was not kept clean.

4. A red chair that contained black stains in the Toddler Classroom; therefore, the chair was not kept clean.

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found that the hot water temperature in the girls' and boys' restrooms, Toddler Classroom, and Infant Classroom measured approximately 65 degrees Fahrenheit; therefore, the hot water was not a minimum temperature of ninety (90) degrees Fahrenheit and a maximum of 120 degrees Fahrenheit. During interview, staff-in-charge stated that she was aware of the hot water and would have it repaired as soon as possible.

2. Green stains on the diaper changing pad and debris underneath the diaper changing pad on the diaper changing table in the Infant Classroom; therefore, the diaper changing surface was not kept clean.

3. Debris on the diaper changing table underneath the diaper changing pad in the Toddler Classroom; therefore, the diaper changing surface was not kept clean.

3. Five (5) yellow metal chain links located around a play structure that were coming up and out of the ground. Staff-in-charge stated that the metal chain links were used to secure another play structure at one time and that she would have the chain links removed.

4. A pink tricycle located beside the fence that was missing the rubber handles and had a broken basket.

5. Loose Christmas lights dangling down part of the fence roll on the side of the playground by the gate entrance.

6. A white pipe bordering a play structure that contained a jagged edge located beside a ladder on the play structure.

7. A red/blue child sized chair that was broken and contained jagged edges.

8. A white pipe bordering a swing set that appeared broken and contained jagged edges.
