General: Based on interview and review of documentation, two (2) caregivers each hired 09/25/19; a caregiver hired 09/24/19; a caregiver hired 09/20/19; a caregiver hired 05/29/19; a caregiver hired 03/28/19, and a caregiver hired 03/19/19, did not have their education verification on file. Interview determined the caregiver hired 09/25/19, was eighteen-years of age but was in high school but there was no documentation on file that she was still in school.

General: Based on review of documentation, two (2) caregivers hired 09/25/19; a caregiver hired 10/04/19; a caregiver hired 09/20/19; a caregiver hired 03/19/19, and a caregiver hired 08/31/18, did not have a TB skin test or a physician statement on file, which indicated they were free from TB.

A caregiver hired 05/29/19, and a caregiver hired 03/28/19, did not complete their orientation training.

A caregiver hired two (2) caregivers each hired 03/19/19, completed their orientation training each on 09/22/19; a caregiver hired 08/31/18, completed orientation training on 01/17/19, and a caregiver hired 08/07/18, completed orientation training on 01/16/19; therefore, these caregivers did not completed their orientation training within the first three (3) months of their employment.

A caregiver hired 09/24/18, completed 0 hours of training; a caregiver hired 08/07/18, completed 8.5 hours of training; a caregiver hired 08/07/18, completed 7 hours of training and a caregiver hired 08/02/18, completed 7 hours of training; within their first year of employment.
