Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, this regulatory requirement was not met. One staff file (hire date: 5/20/19) did not have educational documentation on file

The staff person in charge identified this person as a substitute.

405 - Adequate Substitute(s) Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (6) Child-care centers shall have available in case of need:
- (a) One (1) qualified substitute staff person for a Type II child-care center; or
- (b) Two (2) qualified substitute staff persons for a Type I child-care center.
- (7) Each qualified substitute staff person shall:
- (a) Meet the staff requirements of this administrative regulation; and
- (b) Provide the required documentation to verify compliance with this administrative regulation.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The staff person in charge named two substitute staff; however, one named substitute (hire date: 5/20/19) was not qualified because she did not have educational documentation on file.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, observation and interview, this regulatory requirement was not met. The staff person in charge stated during interview that an agency called UMC Food Ministry provides a hot meal to the children daily and the surveyor observed the agency deliver food (tacos and milk) during the visit. The facility had a contract agreement on file with the agency; however, there was no documentation on site to verify that the meals received from UMC Food Ministry were in compliance with applicable state and local laws

- (f) Minimum staff-to-child ratios and group size established in 922 KAR 2:120; and
- (g) Daily planned program.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, this regulatory requirement was not met. A letter from the DRCC office stating the facility had submitted an acceptable plan of correction and would be recommended for licensure was posted; however, the inspection report and plan of correction from the 1/3/19 post-preliminary inspection was not

The staff person in charge looked through several different binders of paperwork during the visit; however, was not able to locate this document.
