General: Based on observation during a tour of the One-Year-Old classroom, the napping mats were spaced less than 12 inches apart from one another as the children slept.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, there was excessive tape residue on several toy shelves in the One-Year-Old classroom. The tape residue had started to accumulate dirt and grime.
