General: Based on observation, a serving spoon was rinsed in the toddlers' room sink and then used to serve another food item. The center does not have an approved kitchen; therefore, should only use disposable utensils.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, partially emptied sippy cups were stored in the food prep area refrigerator and re-used during the lunch meal.

- (16) A weekly menu shall be:
- (a) Prepared;

General: Based on review of documentation, a child enrolled 03/29/21 had a Tennesee immunization certificate that indicated the immunizations were valid until the child was nineteen (19) months old. The child was currently twenty-five (25) months old.

1265 - Emergency Regulation

922 KAR 2:415E. Emergency Regulation.

Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), licensed child care centers must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:415E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Findings:

General: Based on record review of the screening log, one (1) staff present did not have documentation to indicate she was screened on 04/09/21. Also, a staff member and a child arrived, walked through the school-age room and went to the school-age children's restroom to wash hands. When the staff member and child returned, then their screening was conducted. In accordance with 922 KAR 2:415E Section 7, children and adults shall be screened for fever and contagious symptoms upon entry.

Also, a staff member wore gloves during food preparation and food service of the lunch meal; however, the staff member failed to change the gloves and wash hands each time she used her gloved hand to open and close doors while walking back and forth from the food prep area to each room. In accordance with 922 KAR 2:415E, staff should.....
