Observation of the floor in the girl's bathroom located in the preschool classroom revealed there was a dried yellow substance on the floor around the toilet. Findings: General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain equipment in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the tables where the children eat and work located in the preschool pathways classroom revealed there were three (3) table tops that were soiled with food that was left from the children's morning snack. Continued observation of the classroom revealed there were two (2) teachers in the classroom and they were singing and dancing with the children. 820 - Indoor/Outdoor Equipment Not In Compliance 922 KAR 2:120. Section 11. Toys and Furnishings. (2) Indoor and outdoor equipment shall: (a) Be clean, safe, and in good repair; (b) Meet the physical, developmental needs, and interests of children of different age groups; (c) Be free from sharp points or corners, splinters, protruding nails or bolts, loose or rusty parts, hazardous small parts, lead-based paint, poisonous material, and flaking or chalking paint; and (d) Be designed to guard against entrapment or situations that may cause strangulation. Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care child center failed to maintain equipment in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the windows located in the preschool classroom revealed there was a mass build-up of a dried, black substance throughout the set of window blinds. Observation of the bathroom located in the toddler classroom revealed there was a white plastic laundry basket sitting adjacent to a toilet that the children use that was broken and missing a handle, leaving an area of the basket to have sharp pointed edges. The basket was accessible to the children. Observation of the materials and toys located in the infant 2 classroom revealed a vinyl climbing structure that contained cracks and the inside absorbent material was exposed.

Observation of the 1 room revealed the measuring indicator inside the refrigerator and the measuring indicator built into the refrigerator both measured the inside tempera Fahrenheit; therefore, the temperature was not at or below forty (40) degrees Fahrenheit.

Observation of the microwave located in the kitchen revealed it was soiled with a heavy build-up of dried food. Observation of the freezer located in the kitchen revealed there was dried food particles on the bottom area of the freezer unit under the shelf. Observation of the refrigerator located in the kitchen revealed a dried white and sticky yellow substance on the bottom area of the refrigerator, under the bottom shelf. Observation of the refrigerator located in the infant 2 classroom revealed there was dust and debris on the bottom area of the refrigerator under a shelf.
