General: Based on Review of Documentation, the zoning letter (dated 4/7/09) on file for the YMCA indicated that they had a zoning capacity for up to fifty (50) children. The facility is licensed for a capacity of 112 children. The facility was not in compliance with the local zoning requirements.

(16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:

(a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;

(b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and

(c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, one (1) staff member hired on 8/14/17 did not complete orientation training within the first three (3) months of employment. This staff member completed orientation training on 2/12/18. Two (2) other staff members did not completed fifteeen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within their completed training year. A staff hired on 4/26/16 completed 12.50 hours of training and a substitute staff member hired on 8/12/15 completed twelve (12) hours of training.

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, three (3) children's files did not contain immunization certificates. Another child's file contained a vaccination record from California and it did not contain an expiration date. All of the children had been enrolled in excess of thirty (30) days.

- (i) Parent at the parent's home or place of employment;

- f. Authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence;

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, three (3) children's files were missing a phone number to contact their physician. Two (2) other children's files were missing the name and phone number of their physician. These children were enrolled on 8/16/17 (2 children), 9/11/17, 11/06/17, and 8/07/17. Four (4) children's files were missing a preferred hospital. These children were enrolled on 8/16/17 (2 children), 11/06/17, and 8/07/17.
