General: Based on observation, two (2) caregivers did not wash their hands with liquid soap and warm running water when they arrived in the preschool room.

A caregiver did not wash her hands with soap and warm running water when she arrived in the two-year-olds' room.

A caregiver did not wash her hands with soap and warm running water when she arrived in the infants' room.

A caregiver wore gloves but did not wash her hands with liquid soap and warm running water before and after she diapered three (3) children in the one and one-half-year-olds' room.

A caregiver wore gloves but did not wash her hands with liquid soap and warm running water before and after she diapered a child in the two-year-olds' room.

A caregiver did not wash her hands with liquid soap and warm running water after she wiped three (3) children's noses in the one and one-half-year-olds' room. Interviews and observation revealed the staff used hand sanitizer.
