Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the child care center failed to comply with regulatory requirements. A copy of a current liability insurance policy was not maintained in the file and was unavailable upon request.

- (5) An individual described in subsection (4) of this section shall:
- (a) Submit to background checks described in paragraph (b) of this subsection; (b) May be employed or work with a child on a probationary basis for up to ninety (90) calendar days, pending completion of a:
- 1. Child abuse or neglect check using the central registry in accordance with 922 KAR 1:470;
- 2. Criminal records check required by KRS 199.896(19);
- 3. Criminal records check for any previous state of residence if the person resided outside the state of Kentucky in the last five (5) years; and
- 4. An address check of the Sex Offender Registry; and
- (c) Not be left alone in the presence of a child until copies of the background checks in accordance with paragraph (b) of this subsection have been received by the licensee.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee files in accordance with regulatory requirements. Staff members with hire dates of: 04/11/17 and 10/31/14 failed to have a completed CAN check documented in the file. Upon request, the documentation was unavailable. Interview with the staff in charge revealed the staff members are not working alone.

320 - TB Verification Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

- (1) Child-care center staff:
 - (b) Shall provide, prior to employment and every two (2) years thereafter:
 - 1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or
 - 2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. A staff file for a staff member with a hire date of 05/17/12 failed to contain documentation of a negative tuberculin test or a written statement from a health care professional stating the individual is free of tuberculosis. The missing documentation was requested but was not presented for review.

340 - Training Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

- (14) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 $\frac{1}{2}$) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain employee files in accordance with regulatory requirements. A file review revealed that a staff member with a hire date of 12/16/16 failed to have documentation of 6 hours of cabinet approved orientation training received within the first 3 months of employment. The document was not presented when requested.

- (b) Free of peeling, flaking, or chalking paint.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain equipment in accordance with regulatory requirements. A metal, yellow platform contained within a climbing structure, was missing a steering wheel. Additionally, observed on the outdoor playing area was a sliding board attached to the climbing structure which was in disrepair. The sliding board had been removed from play by the use of caution tape, chain-link fencing and a piece of plywood. The plywood contained splintering wood.

General: Based on review of documentation, the child care center failed to comply with regulatory requirements regarding transportation. Upon request, the center's policies and procedures were not presented for review. The staff in charge stated she was unable to retrieve the records due to a broken file cabinet drawer.

General: Based on review of documentation, the child care center failed to assure compliance with regulatory requirements regarding transportation. Upon request, a third party contract was not presented for review. Staff in charge failed to have access to transportation records due to a broken file cabinet drawer.

2. Written policy that specifies that the procedures that were taught at the orientation training shall be implemented by each child-care center staff member.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain written documentation in accordance with regulatory requirements. A policy stating the staff members would implement information learned during orientation was not presented for review upon request.
