## 922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation completed within the first three (3) months of employment in a child care program;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training completed between July 1 and the following June 30 of each subsequent year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.
- (17) A staff person's compliance with training requirements of this section shall be verified through the cabinet-designated database maintained pursuant to 922 KAR 2:240.

### Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and ECE-Tris records, a staff person hired 9/24/2020, did not complete six hours of cabinet-approved orientation training until 2/13/2021. The training was not completed within the first three months of employment.

520 - Inaccessible Items Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 3. General Requirements.

- (7) The following shall be inaccessible to a child in care:
- (a) Toxic cleaning supplies, poisons, and insecticides;
- (b) Matches, cigarettes, lighters, and flammable liquids; and
- (c) Personal belongings and medications of staff.

### Findings:

General: Based on observation during a tour of the facility, the following was found:

- 1) In the Early Preschool Room, a spray bottle with the words "bleach water" written on the side was stored in an open compartment on the diaper changing station.
- 2) In the boys' bathroom located in the hallway near the indoor gross motor room, a can of Oder Eliminator was stored in a low unlocked cabinet. The label on the can indicates to keep out of the reach of children.

Both items were within reach of the children.

## 580 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings

**Not In Compliance** 

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation during a tour of the facility, the following was found:

- 1) Two water-stained ceiling tiles were found in the Toddler I room.
- 2) In the Toddler II room, scuff marks and areas of chipping and peeling paint were found on the surface of the walls.
- 3) In the Early Preschool room, a long indention was found in the wall near one of the shelves.

# 710 - Toy Sanitation Procedure Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 11. Toys and Furnishings.

- (4) A toy or another item that is considered a mouth contact surface by a child not toilet trained shall be sanitized daily by:
- (a)1. Scrubbing in warm, soapy water using a brush to reach into crevices;
- 2. Rinsing in clean water;
- 3. Submerging in a sanitizing solution for at least two (2) minutes; and
- 4. Air dried; or
- (b) Cleaning in a dishwasher if the toy or other item is dishwasher safe.

### Findings:

General: Based on interview, it was found that one staff person indicated that toys that are mouthed by children not toilet trained are placed in a bucket of bleach water to soak and then removed and placed on a towel to air dry. This process does not meet the requirement for cleaning and sanitizing toys mouthed by children not toilet trained.

First Aid/Medication Not In Compliance

## 730 - Medication Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 7. First Aid and Medicine.

- (6) Medication, including refrigerated medication, shall be:
- (a) Stored in a separate and locked place, out of the reach of a child unless the medication is:
- 1. A first aid supply and is maintained in accordance with subsection (1) of this section;
- 2. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste shall be inaccessible to a child;
- 3. An epinephrine auto-injector. A licensed child-care center shall comply with KRS 199.8951 and 311.646, including:
- a. An epinephrine auto-injector shall be inaccessible to a child;
- b. A child-care center shall have at least one (1) person onsite who has received training on the administration of an epinephrine auto-injector if the child-care center maintains an epinephrine auto-injector;
  - c. A child-care center shall seek emergency medical care for a child if an auto-injector is administered to the child; and
- d. A child-care center shall report to the child's parent and the cabinet in accordance with 922 KAR 2:090, Section 12(1)(b) if an epinephrine auto-iniector is administered to a child: or
- 4. An emergency or rescue medication for a child in care, such as medication to respond to diabetic or asthmatic condition, as prescribed by the child's physician. Emergency or rescue medication shall be inaccessible to a child in care;
- (b) Kept in the original bottle; and
- (c) Properly labeled.
- (7) Medication shall not be given to a child if the medication's expiration date has passed.

### Findings

General: Based on observation, the following was found:

- 1) In the girls' bathroom located beside the gross motor room, a tube of Aquaphor healing ointment was found stored in an unlocked cabinet. The tube of ointment was not labeled for an individual child or adult.
- 2) In the Toddler II room, a container of Aquaphor healing ointment was found stored in an open compartment on the diaper-changing table.

All medication is required to be labeled for an individual and stored in a locked container or area.
