Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the child-care center failed to meet this regulation. The surveyor entered the child-care center at 11:02 a.m. and observed six (6) children and one (1) staff person in the front classroom. The staff person stated the youngest child present was two (2) months old and the oldest child present was two-years-old. Therefore, the classroom was over ratio by one (1) child. The staff person stated the director was in another room changing a child's diaper.

The surveyor entered a second classroom and found the director changing a child's diaper and another child playing with a toy. After the director changed the child's diaper, she and the two (2) children went to the front classroom. It is unknown how long the front classroom was over ratio prior to the surveyor's observation.

children and two (2) staff present. The director stated that when she arrived at 7:30 a.m., she found that the Water Company had shut-off the water due to a non-payment of six hundred dollars. She indicated that she was unaware that there was a balance. The director stated that she made the payment and that the water would be back on by 5:00 p.m. At approximately 12:02 p.m., the director left a voicemail with the surveyor stating that the water had been restored. The surveyor conducted a follow-up visit at approximately 1:11 p.m. and found the water flowing freely from the faucet and found it was 105 degrees Fahrenheit. It is important to note that although the water was turned back on, the child-care center failed to have running water from 7:30 a.m. until noon.
