Findings:

General: Based on Interview, at the time of the initial inspection it was found that the facility did not have two (2) qualified substitute staff in case of need. The facility has three (3) staff and provides care for children ages infant, toddler, preschool and school age.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, in both bathrooms used by the children clear spray bottles that contained a disinfectant solution were observed sitting on a low shelf. The disinfecting solution was accessible to the children. This same disinfecting solution was observed sitting on a shelf in the preschool room.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, in the preschool room and the school age room there was an overhead LED light that was not covered. Documentation to verify the bulbs are shatterproof was not available for review at the time of the inspection.

580 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings Not In Compliance

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, in the girls' bathroom pieces of white vinyl paper were observed attached to the wall behind the sink. There were several areas where the vinyl had peeled away from the wall.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, the outdoor play area had wooden railroad ties that had been used to contain an area where mulch had been placed under equipment used to slide and climb. There were numerous bolts sticking out of the tops of the railroad ties creating a hazard for the children.

755 - Protective Surface Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

- (21) A protective surface shall:
- (a) Be provided for outdoor play equipment used to:
- 1. Climb;
- 2. Swing; and
- 3. Slide; and
- (b) Have a fall zone equal to the height of the equipment.

Findings

General: Based on Observation of the outdoor play there were two (2) small plastic slides sitting on grass. Grass is not an adequate surface to be used under equipment used to slide. In an area that contained mulch and was enclosed using railroad ties two (2) climbers were observed. These climbers were placed close to the railroad ties leaving little space for a fall zone.

- (3) Rest time shall include adequate space specified by the child's age as follows:
- (a) For an infant:
- 1. An individual non-tiered crib that meets Consumer Product Safety Commission standards established in 16 C.F.R. 1219-1220;
- 2. A firm crib mattress in good repair with a clean tight-fitted sheet that shall be changed:
- a. Weekly; or
- b. Immediately if it is soiled or wet;

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, in the infant room there were five (5) cribs. Three (3) of those cribs had sheets that did not fit tightly over the mattress.

815 - Toys/Furniture Not In Compliance

- (1) All toys and furniture contacted by a child shall be:
- (a) Kept clean and in good repair; and
- (b) Free of peeling, flaking, or chalking paint.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, an adult chair was observed in the corner in the preschool room. The edge of the padded seat had a portion of the black vinyl covering missing leaving the foam padding exposed.

820 - Indoor/Outdoor Equipment
