General: Observation of the school age room revealed a current plan of activities was not presented for review.

General: Observation of the school age room revealed a door that did not open or shut properly. The surveyor had to jerk on the door vigorously to get the door open to enter into the restroom.

#### Findings:

General: Observation preschool restroom revealed a dried brown substance smeared on the toilet seat.

## 922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (3) A sink shall be:
- (a) Located in or immediately adjacent to toilet rooms;
- (b) Equipped with hot and cold running water that allows for hand washing;
- (c) Equipped with hot water at a minimum temperature of ninety (90) degrees Fahrenheit and a maximum of 120 degrees Fahrenheit;
- (d) Equipped with liquid soap;
- (e) Equipped with hand-drying blower or single use disposable hand drying material;
- (f) Equipped with an easily cleanable waste receptacle; and
- (g) Immediately adjacent to a changing area used for infants and toddlers.

#### Findings:

General: Observation of the sink located in the toddler classroom revealed there was dried food on the bottom of the sink. Observation of the sink located in the school age room revealed a large buildup of debris and rust on the faucet.

- 2. Beyond twelve (12) months of age as documented by the parent or the child's physician;
- (b) Pasteurized whole milk for children ages twelve (12) months to twenty-four (24) months; or
- (c) Pasteurized low fat one (1) percent or fat-free skim milk for children ages twenty-four (24) months to school-age.

#### Findings:

General: Observation of the refrigerator in the kitchen revealed it contained milk. Review of the label on the milk container revealed it was 2% milk. Observation of lunch served revealed the two-year-old children were being served 2% milk; therefore, the children were not being served 1%, fat-free or skim milk.
