Findings:

90 - Children Supervised

General: Based on observation, the surveyor witnessed a staff person remove four (4) school-age children from the Preschool Classroom and start to take the children into the School Age Classroom. When the surveyor questioned the staff person who would be supervising the children, the staff stated that the children would be in the classroom by themselves; however, the staff person took the school-age children back to the Preschool Classroom.

During interview, the Director stated that when the Preschool Classroom gets over staff-to-child ratio, the staff will send four (4) of the school-age children into the School Age Classroom by themselves. The Director stated that they have been doing this type of arrangement since school let out for summer break. The director also stated that the Preschool Classroom staff would oversee both classrooms. The director stated that she believed it was okay, due to the Preschool Classroom staff being able to hear the school-age children. The surveyor sat in the School-Age Classroom and was not able to see into the Preschool Classroom and had trouble hearing the staff person in the Preschool Classroom; therefore, the children in the School Age Classroom have been out of score of vision and range of voice for an undetermined amount of time and on unknown dates.

Therefore, adequate supervision was not maintained at the child-care center.

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found one (1) staff supervising sixteen (16) children. The staff person stated that the children's ages were 3-years-old to 12-years old; therefore, the child-care center failed to have the minimum number of adult workers.

Staff-in-charge stated that the child-care center was down two (2) staff members.

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found one (1) staff supervising sixteen (16) children. Staff person stated that the children were 3-years-old to 12-years old; therefore, the staff-to-child ratio exceeded by four (4) children.

Staff-in-charge stated that the child-care center was down two (2) staff members.

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found the following:

1. There were thirteen (13) children running around the Preschool Classroom, the children were not wearing socks or shoes. The surveyor observed the children's feet to be dirty. Staff stated that the children were 3-years-old to 12-years-old.

2. There was a bottle of hand soap on the sink in the Preschool Classroom that stated, "Keep Out of Reach of Children," on the back label. The bottle of soap was observed to be within reach of children.

3. In the Nursery, the surveyor found a puddle of water that was seeping under a blue circle rug, causing a slipping hazard. The staff person placed an 11-month old onto the wet rug; therefore, the child-care center compromised the safety & comfort of the child. The Director had the staff person move the eleven-month-old child to another classroom.

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found that the Preschool Classroom had a mixture of preschool children and school-age children with one (1) staff person; therefore, the center did not have the group of children separately maintained and a specific staff assigned to each group.

General: Based on review of documentation from ECE-TRIS, the surveyor found that staff (DOH: 04/12/19) completed zero (0) hours of the required fifteen (15) hours of cabinet approved early care and education training during the timeframe of 07/01/2020 and 06/30/2021.

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found a bottle of Re-Juv-Nal Disinfectant on a ledge that was between the kitchen & the School Age Classroom. The surveyor observed the bottle to have "Danger, Keep Out of Reach of Children," on the front label. The disinfectant was observed to be within reach of children.

585 - Premises Requirements

Findings:

General: Based on observation in the Nursery, the surveyor found a puddle of water that was seeping under a blue circle rug. The surveyor noticed that the water was seeping out from under a locked white door, located in the corner of the Nursery. The surveyor mentioned the puddle of water to the staff person in the classroom, to which the staff replied, "I had just noticed that." The staff person informed the surveyor that behind the locked door was the hot water heater, the staff stated that she would contact a maintenance man.

Staff-in-charge stated that they believe that the hot water heater had burst during the night; therefore, the premises was not kept in good repair.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found sixteen (16) children being cared for in the Preschool Classroom. Based on review of documentation of the child-care center's diagram from DRCC Records, the surveyor found that the Preschool Classroom had a capacity of ten (10) children; therefore, the minimum of thirty-five (35) square feet per child was not maintained.

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found a yellow colored substance located on the toilet bowl, behind the toilet seat; therefore, the toilet was not kept in clean condition.
