Findings:

General: Based on interviews and review of documentation, this regulation was not met as follows:

The surveyor found that on 7/18/19, staff made a fire pit on the playground near the fence-row and allowed preschool and school-age children to roast marshmallows over an open flame. Interviews found that staff created the small fire pit by digging a hole, placing rocks around the hole and then using twigs and brush to start the fire. Facebook photos of the activity show two (2) four-year-old children holding sticks with marshmallows over the flame without assistance. The staff person in charge identified one of the children as her daughter and the other child as another staff person's daughter. The staff person in charge stated the youngest child to participate was three-years-old. She stated that she removed the marshmallows and placed them on the graham crackers for the children.

It is important to note the child-care center was in violation of local ordinance 401 KAR 63:005 as follows:

The child-care center failed to obtain a burn permit, failed to cook in an approved fire pit, and the activity was not twenty-five (25) feet away in all directions of any structure and fence.
