Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor entered the One-Year-Old room at approximately 10:10AM, and found all four (4) children in diapers and no clothes, socks, or shoes on. The surveyor asked the staff person why the children had no clothes on and she replied that they had just finished doing an art project and their clothes were taken off so they would not get them dirty. The surveyor then asked when the children's clothes would be put on and the staff person stated that it would be after they ate lunch. The surveyor noted that lunch was served to the children at 11:00AM and the children were still in diapers

(a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation completed within the first three (3) months of employment in a child-care program;

(b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 $\frac{1}{2}$) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and

(c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training completed between July 1 and the following June 30 of each

subsequent year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

(17) A staff person's compliance with training requirements of this section shall be verified through the cabinet-designated database maintained pursuant to 922 KAR 2:240.

1) Staff hired on 05/28/19 and 07/01/21, did not have the required fifteen (15) hours of cabinet approved training on file.

2) Staff hired on 02/07/22, did not complete the required Orientation training. This staff member has been employed for more than three (3) months.

The ECE-TRIS system was reviewed and confirmed these findings.
