a. Ensures the child is within scope of vision and range of voice; or

b. For a school-age child, within scope of vision or range of voice;

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, interview, and a review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain adequate supervision in accordance with regulatory requirements. Based on observation, when a surveyor entered into the Infant Building on 06/09/16, a room containing five (5) infants and no staff member was revealed. Based on continued observation, approximately ten minutes later, two surveyors re-entered the Infant Building and again found an Infant Room to be unsupervised due to a staff member being in another classroom with another staff member. Based on interviews with staff members working in the Infant Building, staff members leave children unattended during nap time while staff are eating lunch. Based on written documentation, the staff members stated the Infant rooms are left unattended during nap time while staff are outside of the room eating their lunch. Additionally, two (2) rooms in the rear building, with a total of 23 children, ranging in age from 2-7 years old, were found to be insufficiently lit, preventing all children from being within range of sight while sleeping/resting.

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Based on a review of documentation, a staff member with a hire date of 05/11/16, failed to have written verification of a high school diploma, GED, or qualifying documentation from a comparable educational entity.

Based on a review of documentation, a staff member with a hire date of 05/11/16 failed to have a written statement from a health professional stating the individual is free from tuberculosis, or a negative result from a tuberculin test.
