General: Based on interview and review of documentation, a caregiver hired 08/26/22, did not have education verification on file.

A caregiver hired 08/14/19, had a TB documentation on file that was dated 11/19/19. A caregiver hired 08/14/19, had a TB documentation on file that was dated 08/21/19. A caregiver hired 11/19/21, did not have TB documentation on file.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a caregiver's cell phone, keys and drink were stored on top of a desk in room 8. A caregivers sweater hung on a chair and a caregiver's drink set on a child size table in room 5. These items were accessible to children.

General: Based on observation, four (4) preschool children did not wash their hands with liquid soap and warm running water after they returned from outdoor play to classroom 5. Instead, the children picked up books and toys.
