General: Based on observation, a CPR mouthpiece, soap and a flashlight were not present in the first aid supplies.

General: A frozen yellow substance was observed on the inside bottom of freezer in the hallway. The freezer was located near the restrooms. Spider webs were present on the large climbing apparatus on the outdoor playground.
