General: Based on interview and review of documentation, a caregiver, hired on 10/19/21, was not trained in first aid/CPR.

- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training completed between July 1 and the following June 30 of each subsequent year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 $\frac{1}{2}$) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, a caregiver, hired on 7/13/19, completed eight (8) hours of training during a subsequent year of employment. A caregiver, hired on 7/13/19, completed nine and one half (9 ½) hours of training during a subsequent year of employment. Also, two caregivers, hired on 7/31/19 and 8/1/20, each completed fourteen (14) hours of training during a subsequent year of employment. A caregiver, hired on 10/19/21, did not complete six (6) hours of cabinet approved orientation training within the first three (3) months of employment.

- (c) Use hand sanitizer or hand-sanitizing wipes if liquid soap and warm running water are not available in accordance with paragraph (b) of this subsection. The child shall wash the child's hands as soon as practicable once liquid soap and warm running water are available.

General: Based on observation, a child did not wash her hands with liquid soap and warm running water being diapered in the infants' classroom.
