It was found further that the children who are present at lunch-time bring their lunch. An observation of lunch and a review of the posted snack menu found that not all components are served as required by this regulation.

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the staff person in charge stated the facility provides a morning and afternoon snack. A review of the posted menu for September 2021 found the following was listed on various days for the a.m. snack:

- 1) String cheese and water.
- 2) Applesauce cup and water.
- 3) Go-Gurt and water.
- 4) Nutri-grain Bar and water.
- 5) Fig Bar and water.
- 6) Special K Bar and water.

Two components are required for a snack. Water does not meet the requirement as a component for snack.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the staff person in charge stated the facility provides a morning snack and an afternoon snack. A review of the posted menu for September 2021 found that the week of September 27, 2021 "variety snack" and water was listed for the morning and afternoon snack. The staff person in charge stated the children are served remaining single serve items that were not eaten earlier in the month.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, at the time of the survey the children were observed eating lunch. The staff person in charge stated that the children bring their lunch because the facility does not provide lunch. It was found that the lunches the children brought did not meet the requirements and there were no items supplemented to assure each lunch contained the required components.

The following lunches were observed:

- 1) Juicy Juice, nacho cheese chips, squeezable applesauce, sandwich and water.
- 2) Corn Chips, macaroni and cheese, chicken nuggets, peaches and water.
- 3) An Uncrustable brand sandwich, oranges, Jello, Goldfish Crackers and water.
