(1) A person who is a child care staff member prior to January 1, 2018, shall submit to and complete background checks in accordance with this administrative regulation no later than September 30, 2018.

(2) A child care staff member hired on or after April 1, 2018, shall:

(a) Have completed the background checks required in accordance with this administrative regulation and been found to have no disqualifying offense prior to becoming a child care staff member; or

(b)1. Have submitted to the background checks required in accordance with this administrative regulation;

2. Not be left unsupervised with a child in care pending the completion of the background checks in accordance with this administrative regulation: and

3. Be dismissed or relocated from the residence if the person is found to have a disgualifying background check result.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the surveyor found the following:

1. A staff's (DOH: 04/30/21) file did not contain documentation of background checks submitted through the Kentucky National Background Check Service. Based on review of the Kentucky National Background Check Service, the staff member did not have a completed background check prior to 10/01/21. During interview, staff-in-charge stated that she was not aware that staff person had to have a completed background check through the Kentucky National Background Check Service by 10/01/21. The surveyor observed the staff person working with children in the Preschool Classroom with another staff (DOH: 07/20/20) that did not have a completed background check through the Kentucky National Background Check Service by 10/01/21. The staff's file contained a completed Child Abuse/Neglect Background Check dated 04/30/21 and a completed Criminal Records Background Check dated 04/20/21.

2. A staff's (DOH: 12/16/20) file did not contain documentation of background checks submitted through the Kentucky National Background Check Service. Based on review of the Kentucky National Background Check Service, the staff member did not have a completed background check prior to 10/01/21. During interview, staff-in-charge stated that she was not aware that staff person had to have a completed background check through the Kentucky National Background Check Service by 10/01/21. The surveyor did not observe the staff person working alone with children. Staff-in-charge stated that the staff person has not worked alone with children. The staff's file contained a completed Child Abuse/Neglect Background Check dated 12/11/20 and a completed Criminal Records Background Check dated 11/17/20.

3. A staff's (DOH: 07/20/20) file did not contain documentation of background checks submitted through the Kentucky National Background Check Service. Based on review of the Kentucky National Background Check Service, the staff member did not have a completed background check prior to 10/01/21. During interview, staff-in-charge stated that she was not aware that staff person had to have a completed background check through the Kentucky National Background Check Service by 10/01/21. The surveyor observed the staff person working with children in the Preschool Classroom with another staff (DOH: 04/30/21) that did not have a completed background check through the Kentucky National Background Check Service by 10/01/21. The staff's file contained a completed Child Abuse/Neglect Background Check dated 07/20/20 and a completed Criminal Records Background Check dated 07/24/20.

(8) To qualify for a preliminary license, or maintain a regular license, a child-care center shall:

(d) Provide written proof of liability insurance coverage of at least \$100,000 per occurrence;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the surveyor found that the child-care centers liability insurance was no longer current as of 08/21/20. During interview with a staff-incharge, the surveyor was informed that the child-care centers insurance was current; however, documentation was not presented during the renewal survey.

225 - Licensee Responsibility

922 KAR 2:090. Section 8. General.

(1) A licensee shall:

(a) Be responsible for the operation of the child-care center pursuant to this administrative regulation, 922 KAR 2:120, and 922 KAR 2:280; and (b) Protect and assure the health, safety, and comfort of each child.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found the following:

1. A gray basket placed on a gray shelf in the Two Year Old Classroom that contained a can of shaving cream that stated "Keep Out of the Reach of Children" on the back label. The gray basket was observed to be within reach of the children.

2. A brown shelf that when touched fell slightly forward and appeared to be broken located in the Preschool Classroom.

3. A purple container placed on a shelf beside the exit door in the Three Year Old Classroom that contained the following: a tube of Crest 3D White that stated "Keep Out of the Reach of Children" on the back label and a clear bottle of solution that was missing the front label; however, the back label read "Keep Out of the Reach of Children." The purple container was observed to be within reach of the children.

4. A black bucket with a label on the front that stated "Germ Bucket" placed on a shelf by a wall mounted television and contained a small brush, orange cleaning sponge, and white Mr. Clean Magic Eraser. The Mr. Clean Magic Eraser was brown and appeared to have been used. The black bucket was observed to be within reach of the children.

5. A pink clear container with candy placed on top of a tall shelf in the Three Year Old Classroom that was broken and appeared to have jagged edges. During interview, staff stated that the children sometimes pick their own candy from the container.
