General: Based on review of documentation, two (2) caregivers hired on 10/1/19 and 12/9/19, did not have an annual performance evaluation on file.

350 - Health, Safety, Comfort 922 KAR 2:090. Section 10. Director Requirements and Responsibilities.

(1) A director shall:

(I) Assure the health, safety, and comfort of each child;

General: Based on observation, two (2) car seats were stored on top of the children's cubby coat rack. The car seats were not stable on top of the cubby and one of the car seats was placed on the edge of the cubby. The cubby coat rack was approximately four (4) feet tall. A bottle warmer (in use) was positioned on top of a refrigerator in the infants' room. The refrigerator was eighteen (18) inches tall and was placed directly on the floor. The bottle warmer was accessible to the mobile infants in the infants' room.

360 - Caregiver Alone **Not In Compliance**

922 KAR 2:090. Section 10. Director Requirements and Responsibilities.

- (1) A director shall:
- (n) Assure that a person acting as a caregiver of a child in care shall not be left alone with a child, if the licensee has not received the results of the background checks as described in 922 KAR 2:280;

Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, a caregiver hired on 1/26/21, was left alone and cared for six (6) children in the toddlers' room for less than one (1) minute. The caregiver did not have a processed criminal records check on file.

410 - Training Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 $\frac{1}{2}$) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver hired on 8/17/20, did not complete six (6) hours of cabinet approved orientation training within the first three (3) months of employment. The training was completed on 1/11/21.

General: Based on observation, the center's crawl space access door was open and was accessible to children in the outdoor play area. The opening was approximately two (2) feet by two (2) feet wide.

755 - Protective Surface Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

- (21) A protective surface shall:
- (a) Be provided for outdoor play equipment used to:
- 1. Climb;
- 2. Swing: and
- 3. Slide; and
- (b) Have a fall zone equal to the height of the equipment.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a Fisher Price slide and a Little Tikes slide were placed on a thin layer of mulch and a Step 2 slide and a basketball Step 2 slide were placed on the ground in the outdoor play area.

- 2. A firm crib mattress in good repair with a clean tight-fitted sheet that shall be changed:
- a. Weekly; or
- b. Immediately if it is soiled or wet;

General: Based on observation, a white sheet and a green sheet loosely fit on crib mattresses in the infants' room.

General: Based on observation, a Safety 1st feeding booster chair did not have safety restraints in the multipurpose room. A Safety 1st feeding booster chair did not have safety restraints in the infants' room.

General: Based on observation and interview, the center received lunch from a feeding program offered through a local school. However, the center did not have a copy of the school's Food Service Permit.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, dried food was splattered across the inside, top wall of the microwave in the multipurpose room.

1125 - Same Food Not In Compliance

(14) All children should be offered the same food items unless the child's parent or health professional documents a dietary restriction that necessitates an alternative food item for the child.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, children were served pizza and carrots for lunch. However for the fruit component, some children received mixed fruit while others received pineapple. Therefore, all the children did not receive the same fruit for lunch.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the center's evacuation plan was last updated on 9/18/19, which was not in accordance with KRS 199.895.

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, eleven (11) children were present at the center. However, only ten (10) children had a documented arrival time.

General: Based on review of documentation, three (3) caregivers hired on 8/17/20, 6/29/20, 3/11/20, and two (2) caregivers hired on 10/1/19, did not have a professional development plan on file.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, the center failed to assure:

- 1.) New staff shall undergo name-based background and shall not be left alone with children until name-based background checks have been approved and returned, in accordance with 922 KAR 2:410E Section 11. A caregiver hired on 1/26/21, did not have a processed criminal records check on file. The caregiver was left alone and cared for six (6) children in the toddlers' room for less than one (1) minute.
- 2.) Machine washable toys shall not be used, in accordance with 922 KAR 2:410E Section 6. A stuffed toy caterpillar was on a shelf in the preschool/school-age room.
