- (c) Have an approved water and sewage system in accordance with local, county, and state laws;

Findinas:

Based on observation, the child care center failed to comply with regulatory requirements regarding General Administration. The child care center did not maintain running water throughout the kitchen, restrooms and the sinks located in the classrooms.

155 - Liability Insurance Not In Compliance

- (8) To qualify for a preliminary license, or maintain a regular license, a child-care center shall:
- (d) Provide written proof of liability insurance coverage of at least \$100,000 per occurrence;

Findings

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain written documentation in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the staff in charge did not present verification that the child care center maintained a current copy of liability insurance coverage.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center staff in charge failed to assure compliance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the staff in charge did not present verification of a current copy of the administrative regulations.

- 3. Commonwealth Child Care Credential as described in 922 KAR 2:250;

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the childcare center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the staff in charge did not provide verification that the record of the employee with the hire date of 10/30/2019, contained a copy of a high school diploma, GED or a commonwealth child care credential.

395 - TB Verification Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (1) Child-care center staff:
- (b) Shall provide, prior to employment and every two (2) years thereafter:
- 1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or
- 2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the staff in charge did not present verification that the record of two (2) employee with the hire date of 10/30/2019 contained a current copy of a statement with a date that was verifiable from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis or a copy of negative tuberculin results.

- (d) Unless the child-care center is a before- or after-school program that operates part day or less, that offers a variety of creative activities

- 5. Science or nature;

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the child care center failed to comply with regulatory programming requirements. Upon request, the staff in charge did not present verification that the daily activity of programming was posted in writing that had been updated to reflect the entire day that included the activities that are individualized and developmentally appropriate for four (4) of the four (4) classrooms

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. The exit door to the playground did not contain a door handle to pull the door open.



645 - Sink Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (3) A sink shall be:
- (a) Located in or immediately adjacent to toilet rooms;
- (b) Equipped with hot and cold running water that allows for hand washing;
- (c) Equipped with hot water at a minimum temperature of ninety (90) degrees Fahrenheit and a maximum of 120 degrees Fahrenheit;
- (d) Equipped with liquid soap;
- (e) Equipped with hand-drying blower or single use disposable hand drying material;
- (f) Equipped with an easily cleanable waste receptacle; and
- (g) Immediately adjacent to a changing area used for infants and toddlers.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. The three (3) sinks located in the the center was not equipped with hot and cold running water that allows for hand washing.

650 - Toilet Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (4) Each toilet shall:
- (a) Be kept in clean condition;
- (b) Be kept in good repair;
- (c) Be in a lighted room; and
- (d) Have ventilation to outside air.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the restroom revealed that the two (2)toilets did not flush due to no running water.

- 6. Free of any items not used for diaper changing.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to comply with hygienic practices in accordance with regulatory requirements. The changing pad located in the two-year-old classroom revealed a small rip in the middle of the pad, with the inside foam exposed. Therefore, the changing pad was not kept in a hygienic manner.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain an outdoor play area in accordance with regulatory requirements. The playground area contained numerous overgrown weeds. The latch to the gate was broken. Continued observation revealed a twelve (12) inch PVC pipe extending from the concrete wall, creating a potential hazard. Therefore, the playground was not maintained in good condition.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain equipment in accordance with regulatory requirements. The mats to be utilized for naptime were one-inch thick mats and not the required two (2) inch thick mats.

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain food service in accordance with regulatory requirementss. Upon request, the staff in charge did not present vertiifacation that the center had obtained a food service permit.

General: Based on observation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain food service in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the staff in charge did not present verification that a menu had been completed and posted in a conspicuous place for review.

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain written documentation in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the staff in charge did not present verification that the evacuation plan in the event of a fire, natural disaster, or other threatening situation that may pose a health or safety hazard for a child in care had been submitted to the local emergency management team.

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain written documentation in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the child care staff in charge did not present verification that the child care center had developed staff policies and procedures.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the child care center failed to comply with regulatory programming requirements. Upon request, the staff in charge did not present verification of a written schedule of staff working hours that included the current employees.

1190 - Orientation Procedure Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 2. Child Care Services.

(3)(b) The program shall include:

2. Written policy that specifies that the procedures that were taught at the orientation training shall be implemented by each child-care center staff member.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain written documentation in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the staff in charge did not present verification of a written policy that specifies that each child-care center staff member will receive orientation training with the first ninety (90) days of hire and the employee shall implement the procedures that were taught at the orientation training.

Upon request, the staff in charge did not present verification that a written plan outlining the course of action in the event of a natural or manmade disaster that was posted in a prominent place in the center.
