- 1. Child abuse and neglect central registry pursuant to 922 KAR 1:470;
- 2. National Crime Information Center's National Sex Offender Registry in accordance with 34 U.S.C. 20921; and
- 3. Sex Offender Registry established in accordance with KRS 17.500 through 17.580.

General: Based on a review of documentation and interview, two (2) caregivers hired 9/27/21 and 10/1/21, did not initiate the process of obtaining background checks in the National Background Check Portal (NBCP).

General: Based on observation and interview, a white substance was on a shelf in the refrigerator in the kitchen. Also, a white substance was on the shelf in the refrigerator and a sour smell came from inside the small refrigerator when the door was opened in the two-year-olds' room.
