#### Findings:

General: Based on observation during an inspection of the outdoor play area, the following was found:

- 1) A leaf blower, bug spray, two metal ladders and a riding lawnmower were accessible to the children.
- 2) A tall wooden climber with a slide and swings was observed. The mulch was scattered under the equipment making the mesh weed block visible. The piece of equipment was tall enough that the sparse mulch did not provide adequate cushioning if a child should fall.
