General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver hired 06/12/2020, had TB documentation on file that was dated 09/02/19. A caregiver hired 08/12/21 and a caregiver hired 07/21/21, did not have TB documentation on file.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation, the radio played music from a local radio station while the children sat and played with toys in the infant and Explorer room. The music had adult content and was not a part of the planned program of activities.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation, a caregiver's drink and two (2) bottles of water were stored on a shelf in the four-year-old room. A bottle of hand sanitizer set on a shelf in the four-year-old room. The bottle of hand sanitizer was labeled "Keep out of reach of children". These items were accessible to children.

## 570 - Items Accessible Only During Activity

- (8) The following shall be inaccessible to a child in care unless under direct supervision and part of planned program of instruction:
- (a) Knives and sharp objects;

### Findings

General: Based on observation, six (6) large plastic bags were stored on the floor, in a closet, in the two-year-old's room. The closet door was opened which allowed these items, that were not a part of the planned program of instruction, to be accessible to children.

## 700 - Child Personal Care/Handwashing

922 KAR 2:120. Section 3. General Requirements.

- (4) A child shall:
- (a) Be helped with personal care and cleanliness based upon his or her developmental skills;
- (b) Except as established in paragraph (c) of this subsection, wash his or her hands with liquid soap and warm running water:
- 1. a. Upon arrival at the center; or
- b. Within thirty (30) minutes of arrival for school-age children;
- 2. Before and after eating or handling food;
- 3. After toileting or diaper change;
- 4. After handling animals;
- 5. After touching an item or an area of the body soiled with body fluids or wastes; and
- 6. After outdoor or indoor play time; and
- (c) Use hand sanitizer or hand-sanitizing wipes if liquid soap and warm running water are not available in accordance with paragraph (b) of this subsection. The child shall wash the child's hands as soon as practicable once liquid soap and warm running water are available.

## Findings:

General: Based on observation, six (6) children did not wash their hands with liquid soap and warm running water before they ate lunch in the Explorer room. A toddler child did not wash her hands with liquid soap and warm running water after she was diapered in the Explorer room.

- (5) Staff shall:
- (a) Maintain personal cleanliness;
- (b) Conform to hygienic practices while on duty;
- (c) Except as established in paragraph (d) of this subsection, wash their hands with liquid soap and running water:
- 1. Upon arrival at the center;
- 2. After toileting or assisting a child in toileting;
- 3. Before and after diapering each child;
- 4. After wiping or blowing a child's or own nose;
- 5. After handling animals;
- 6. After caring for a sick child;
- 7. Before and after feeding a child or eating;
- 8. Before dispensing medication;
- 9. After smoking or vaping; and
- 10. If possible, before administering first aid; and
- (d) Use hand sanitizer or hand-sanitizing wipes if liquid soap and warm running water are not available in accordance with paragraph (c) of this subsection. The staff shall wash the staff's hands as soon as practicable once liquid soap and warm running water are available.

## Findings:

General: Based on observation, a caregiver did not wash her hands with liquid soap and warm running water before she fed an infant in the infants' room. A caregiver did not wash her hands with liquid soap and warm running water before and after she diapered a toddler child in the Explorer room. A caregiver did not wash her hands with liquid soap and warm running after after she fed an infant in the infants' room.

## 730 - Diaper Changing Area/Surface

- 6. Free of any items not used for diaper changing.

## Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, a radio, a paper, a pen, rubber-bands, infant socks and a clipboard were stored on the diaper changing surface in the Explorer room.

#### 740 - Diapering Practice Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 12. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (12) Staff shall disinfect the diapering surface after each child is diapered.
- (13) If staff wears disposable gloves, the gloves shall be changed and disposed after each child is diapered.

General: Based on observation and interview, a caregiver did not disinfect the diaper changing mat in the infant and Explorer room.

General: Based on observation, the black fabric peeled and hung down from the back side of the wooden changing table in the infant/Explorer room.
