General: Based on review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain state regulations. During the survey, it was found that the center did not maintain an accurate Kentucky Applicant Registry and Employment Screening (KARES) report. The facility was combined with two (2) other facilities, thus creating a report for the facility that was inaccurate.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain state regulations. The following was found:

- 1.) In the Two's Room, a can of Glade air freshener was observed sitting on a small shelf on the left side of the room, in reach of children in care.
- 2.) In the Two's Room there was a set of personal keys on top of the back cubby, in reach of children in care.

625 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings Not In Compliance

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care facility failed to maintain state regulations. The second bathroom in the back hallway contained a gash on the back wall beside the toilet, exposing the drywall.

General: Based on observation, the child care failed to maintain state regulations. During the survey, it was found that the toilet in the staff/adult bathroom, located in the back hallway behind the breakroom, had a broken handle and would only flush if the back of the toilet was removed and the inner mechanism was manipulated.

In addition, a water hose attached to the water spigot, was not secured and accessible to children on the playground. This created a tripping hazard to the children in care.
